

## A Fresh Look at Sacraments – "Outward signs that give grace"


We are very well acquainted with signs – they are all around us. In fact we are surrounded by signs – on the streets giving us the speed limit, warning of merging traffic and detours, or the presence of school zones. Other signs awaken impulses to satisfy our hunger at the nearest restaurant, ice cream shop, or the nearness of any number of other delectable treats, places to shop, or stay.

There are other signs in our lives that are much more important and much more truly human than the metal or flashing billboards that market products. Walk with me into an airport to an arrival gate for a flight coming from some distant land. A lot of people have been waiting a long time because the flight was delayed. Finally the plane arrives at the gate and after what seems an eternity the door opens and people begin streaming out looking all about them for familiar faces. All of a sudden there is recognition and a quick dash into each other's arms, with emotion filled hugs and kisses, holding on as if they would never let go of each other. Between hugs, you pull back a little and look at each other as if to make sure each other is still there. I don't need to describe that scene with any more detail. You have all experienced it in person. You know how it feels. Visible, physical signs that express, communicate, the intimate, and at the same time, the inexpressible deep relationship between people. Before our eyes a re-bonding happens, love and healing happens. You have all participated in such a blessed moment, truly a sacrament.

Sacraments are truly actions and rituals so often taken for granted. Most often they are received and participated in with no thought. And yet they are outward signs and actions of something very personal, deeply effective. As we celebrate and receive the sacraments, we are sustaining and deepening of our relationships with each other. The sacraments are a deeply personal meeting — an encounter, a re-aquaintance with the ones from whom we have been separated for a short while, or in some instances a longer space of time. They are an encounter with Christ in his body — the Church present in St. Joseph Church. By themselves they are nothing, but empty actions with empty material objects and words. However, in the community of the Christ's Church they become the water and oil that binds us, making us a community that is for each other and our joint mission to make this world a better place for our children. Here we receive the food that

nourishes and a strengthening that sustains us when we tire, the word that heals our wounds and reconciles our differences, binding us together once again as a many stranded wire. Here we are bound together as many members of the body of Christ, now present in this world in as many places as we live and work and travel.

# Stewardship: The Faithful Discern Stewardship Priorities

In the background paper, "Stewardship: A Disciple's Way of Life," author Barbara Vite, parish stewardship director, Archdiocese of Milwaukee says, "Faithful stewards receive God's gifts gratefully because they understand that we have done nothing to deserve the bounty



showered upon us by our generous God. He has given us all, including his Son, because of his great love for us. Good stewards cherish and tend these gifts in a responsible and accountable manner for they know these gifts are not meant to be left idle or squandered away. Gifts given are meant to be nourished, to grow and to multiply.

"Authentic stewardship flows from a profound sense of gratitude that develops as each individual deepens in personal relationship with the Lord. As that connection becomes stronger the need to give increases until it overflows the banks of our resistance."

Below are the top two priorities in Stewardship voted on at the Synod.

**First Priority – 27% – Training for Parish Action Groups:** Develop educational programming and materials to train small outreach/stewardship/evangelization action groups in every parish to focus on internal and external invitation and engagement.

Second Priority – 23% – Multi-Generational Programs: Develop multi-generational programming on the theology of stewardship that incorporates events and service components.

Other areas of stewardship such as training for pastors and associates, Archdiocesan-wide offertory process, curriculum for schools and formation were discussed and discerned, and will be taken into consideration as Archbishop Listecki creates his Synodal Declaration. The next key mission area to be featured will be Leadership – the eighth and final area discerned at the Synod. On September 14, Archbishop Listecki will issue a Synodal Declaration, which will include the priorities set for the Archdiocese for the next 10-15 years. The information from the Synod will assist Archbishop Listecki in his discernment process in creating this Declaration.

#### **Labor Day: Celebration of the American Worker**

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the labor movement and is a national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country.

The vital force of labor has enabled America to achieve the highest standard of living and the greatest production the world has ever known. It has been the catalyst in our quest to attain the ideals of economic and political democracy. It is appropriate, therefore, that the nation pay tribute on Labor Day to the source of so much of the nation's strength, freedom, and leadership — the American worker. We are reminded also on this day of the Fifth Principle of Catholic Social Teaching: "Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers" which proclaims that people have a right to decent and productive work, fair wages, private property, economic initiative and the right to organize. In return, workers are responsible to provide a fair day's work for a fair day's pay; treat employers and co-workers with respect; and carry out work in a way that contributes to the common good. 
